

Norfolk County Council proposes to make a Temporary Traffic Regulation Order (the "Order") (NTRO9331) affecting the A149 Yarmouth Road/High Road from 600m northwest of its junction with Potter Heigham FP17 for 1200m north-westwards (the "Road") in the Parishes of Potter Heigham and Repps with Bastwick to facilitate construction works for Middle Wall access track, the Road will be temporarily subject to a 30mph speed restriction for the duration of the works/period the restriction is necessary which is anticipated to be from 1st April 2025 to 1st July 2026, but may continue to be restricted until the 30th September 2026 where the closure/restriction is still required beyond the anticipated dates.

Alternative route is via: N/A.

The works promoter for this closure is: Norfolk County Council.

Vehicular access will be permitted to a final destination in the Road where signs indicating such access is possible and permitted are in place.

The Order shall automatically revoke on the completion of the works/when the restriction is no longer necessary or otherwise on the 30th September 2026 without further notice.

If necessary, the restriction could run for a maximum period of 18 months from the date the Order is effective.

A person who contravenes, or who uses or permits the use of a vehicle in contravention of the restriction imposed by the Order shall be guilty of an offence.

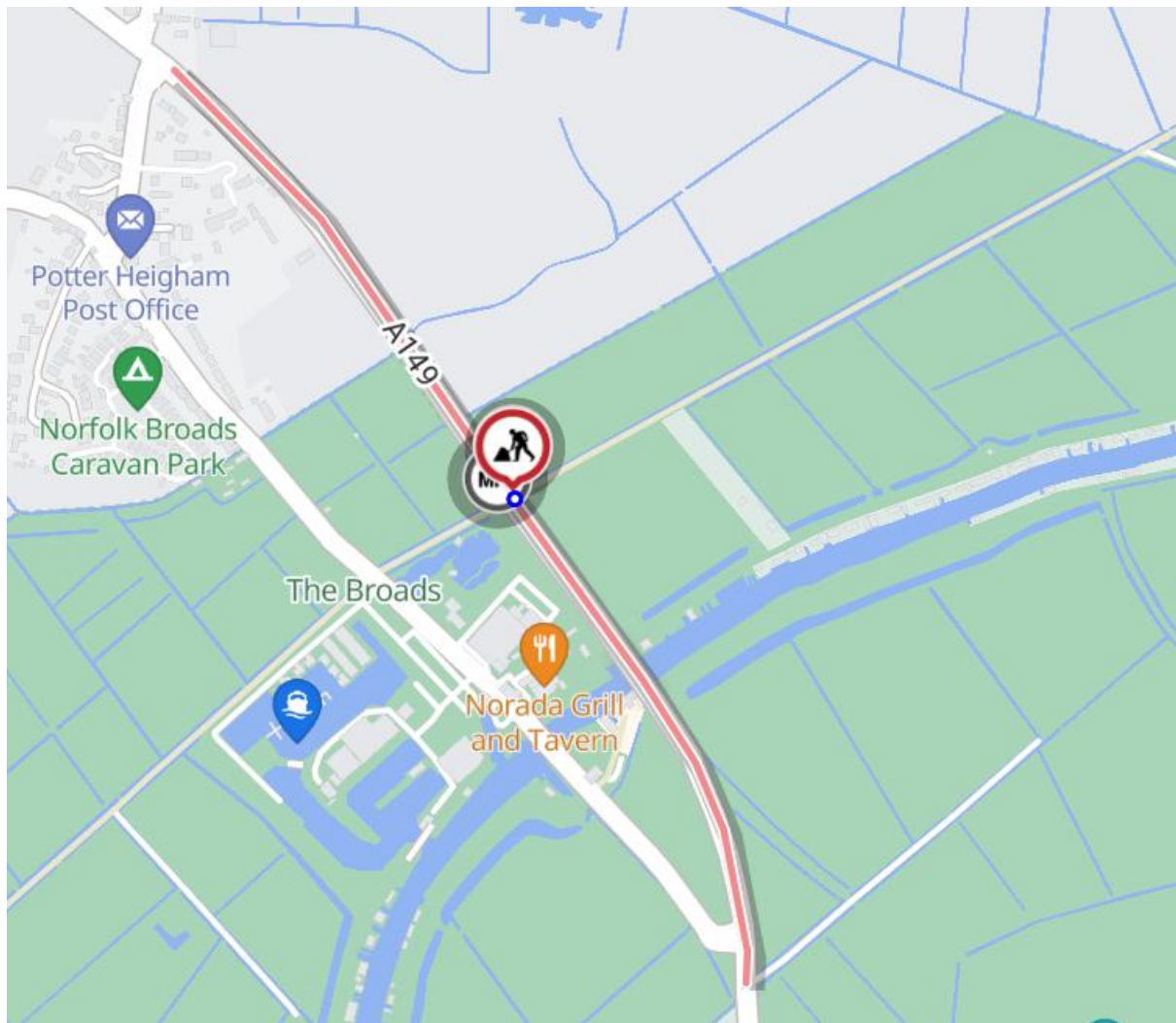
Penalty: £1000 maximum fine on conviction and/or endorsement for contravention.
